

## Our Locations

Bethesda Project operates a continuum of care throughout Center City Philadelphia utilizing a Housing First approach, minimizing barriers to access and allowing each individual to take his or her own journey of healing at their own pace, being understanding of setbacks and building on accomplishments in self-sufficiency.



### EMERGENCY SHELTER

Individuals who are homeless receive supportive services and emergency shelter. This program is a first step in accessing services and housing in the community.



### ENTRY-LEVEL HOUSING

Individuals who are chronically homeless and struggle with severe and persistent mental illness, serious medical conditions, and/or addiction receive food, shelter and referrals to needed services. Bethesda Project staff reach out to those most reluctant to enter shelter with tenacious, dignified care and help them transition to housing.



### PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING

Men and women with mental illnesses or other disabilities receive a combination of housing and on-site supportive services to assist them in living stably within the community.



### INDEPENDENT HOUSING

Men and women capable of a high degree of self-sufficiency live in independent settings.

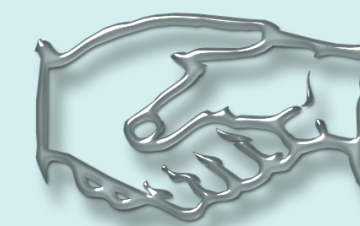

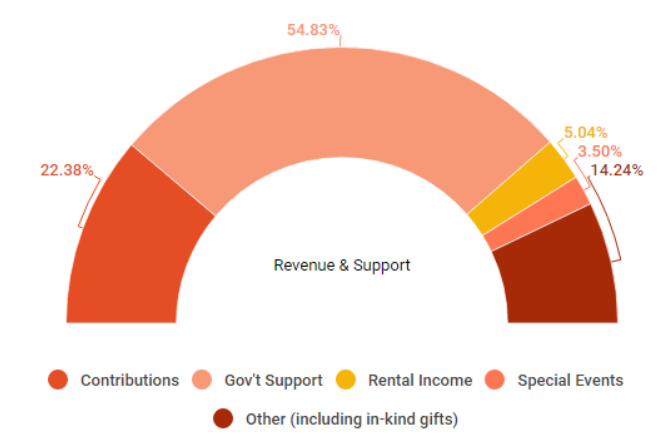

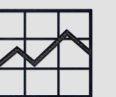
### 2016 Revenue & Support

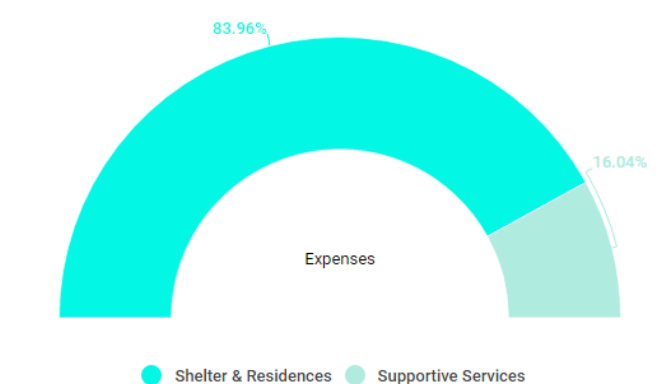
